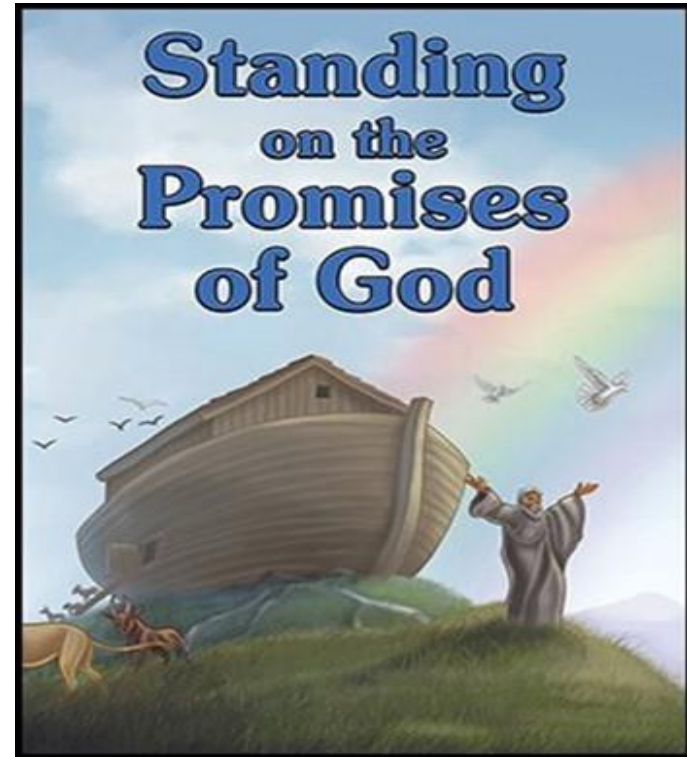

**God’s Prayer Book
The Psalms**

The biblical book of Psalms contains almost every human emotion prayed back to God. The poetry of Psalms allows us to take the experiences of the psalmists and identify our experiences, emotions, and attitudes. The Psalms do not hold back in their emotions, they accuse God of being unfair, unjust, or allowing the wicked to get away with their sins. Yes, they tell God they hate God. And we find there the richness of God’s compassion, the awe at God’s glory, and the thrill of God’s redemption and deliverance.

This week’s prayer exercise is to use the Psalms as models for our prayer. Sometimes we pray the words back to God, then we can paraphrase them to our situation, finally we can compose our own prayers modeled after the Psalm.

Journaling this week—

- Use one of these Psalms for your prayer exercise.
- Read it aloud. Identify the emotion of the psalmist.
- Personalize it, use “I” statements, name your situation.
- Pray it back to God.
- Write a prayer modeled on the Psalm.

Suggested Psalms to use

- To Give Praise - Psalm 30:1-5
- To Trust in God - Psalm 37:1-5
- To Pray for Deliverance - Psalm 40:1-4

- To Pray For Protection - Psalm 46:7-11
- To Pray When You Are Overwhelmed - Psalm 55:18-23
- To Worship God For all He Has Done - Psalm 103:1-2
- To Give Thanks For His Mercy - Psalm 106:1-5
- To Give Thanks For Answered Prayers - Psalm 116:1-2
- To Remember God Made Us - Psalm 139:13-14
